THIS MONTH'S FEATURE FILMS

SHERLOCK HOLMES: A GAME OF SHADOWS

Guy Ritchie directs this action/crime adventure starring Robert Downey, Jr., Jude Law and Jared Harris, who reprise their roles as Holmes, Watson and Moriarty, with Rachel McAdams returning as Irene Adler. Noomi Rapace plays Sim and Stephen Fry is Mycroft Holmes. Holmes and Watson continue their antics to outwit and bring down their fiercest adversary, Professor Moriarty. This film contains stunning action scenes, costumes and cinematography. (Rated PG-13, 2H 9M)

WE BOUGHT A ZOO

Cameron Crowe co-wrote and directed this feel good, comedic family drama set in Southern California, but based on a true story that took place in England. A father moves his young family to the countryside to renovate and re-open a struggling zoo, starring Matt Damon, Scarlett Johansson and Thomas Hayden Church. (Rated PG, 2H 4M)

WAR HORSE

Steven Spielberg directs this epic, dramatic story of WWI. Albert (Jeremy Irvine) enlists after his beloved horse, Joey, is sold to the cavalry. Albert's hopeful journey takes him out of England and across Europe as the war rages on. Emily Watson and David Thewlis also star. The multiple tightly interwoven subplots give this film a feeling of grand analogy. (Rated PG-13, 2H 26M)

TINKER, TAILOR, SOLDIER, SPY

Tomas Alfredson directs this spy thriller that takes place in the bleak days of the Cold War. Espionage veteran George Smiley (Gary Oldman) is forced from semi-retirement to uncover a Soviet agent within British Intelligence, MI6's, echelons. Colin Firth also stars as Bill Haydon, and Tom Hardy is rogue agent Ricki Tarr. This is an absorbing film that will leave a lasting impact. (Rated R, 2H 7M)

THE DESCENDANTS

In his first full length film since Sideways, Alexander Payne co-wrote and directed this comedic drama about a dedicated Hawaiian land baron, Matt King, brilliantly played by George Clooney, who desperately tries to re-connect with his two daughters after their mother is injured in a boating accident. The oldest daughter Alexandra is perfectly played by Shailene Woodley and the younger daughter Scottie is also very well acted by newcomer Amara Miller. The supporting cast, made up of Beau Bridges, Judy Greer, Nick Krause, Robert Forster and an almost unrecognizable Matthew Lillard, are all excellent in their small roles. (Rated R, 1H 55M)

CAMEO CINEMA ART & FAMILY FILM SERIES

THE BROTHERS WARNER Jan 4 at 8:15pm/Jan 6 at 2:30pm
Cass Warner, granddaughter of Harry, wrote and directed this intimate portrait and saga of four film pioneers—Harry, Albert, Sam and Jack—who rose from immigrant poverty through personal tragedies, persevering to create a major studio with a social conscience. The brothers were as different as any four people could be - the outlandish Jack, the good businessman Harry, the kind-hearted Sam, and the quiet Albert - but the main characters are Jack and Harry. Interviews of some key stars and staff are quite insightful. This is a fascinating documentary. (Documentary, 1H 30M)

THE MUPPETS Jan 7 & 8 at 12:00pm — James Bobin directs this delightful musical family comedy about when the Muppets, with the help of three fans, must reunite to save their old theater from a greedy oil tycoon. The film stars the voices of Amy Adams as Mary, Jason Segal (who also wrote the screenplay) as Gary and Chris Cooper as Tex Richman. The challenge is finding all the muppets, who split up years before, and are scattered in all directions. (Rated PG, 1H 43M)

TOMBOY Jan 11 at 8:00pm/ Jan 13 at 2:30pm — Céline Sciamma wrote and directed this French drama about a 10 year- old girl, who is mistaken for a boy as she is trying to fit into her new neighborhood outside Paris. She must keep up the charade because it is too late for the mistake to be clarified. Zoe Héran, Malonn Lévana and Jeanne Disson star in this mesmerizing story that takes on some challenging themes but does so with beauty and craft that gives you a renewed belief in the good of the world. (Not rated, 1H 24M)

LE HAVRE Jan 18 at 8:00pm/ Jan 20 at 2:30pm — Finnish director Aki Kaurismäki wrote and directed this French comedic drama about a runaway African boy who arrives on a cargo ship in the port city of Le Havre, where an aging shoe shiner takes pity on the child and welcomes him into his home. Blondin Miguel plays the boy, Idrissa, André Wilms is Marcel Marx, Kati Outinen is Arletty and Jean-Pierre Darroussin is Monet. This film takes a worldwide problem and creates a charming, feel-good odyssey. Beautifully shot by cinematographer Timo Salminen, the port city has the look and feel of the sixties or seventies. (Not rated, 1H 33M)

ALVIN AND THE CHIPMUNKS: CHIPWRECKED

Jan 21 & 22 at 12:00pm — Mike Mitchell directs this lovable family animated comedy. Playing around while aboard a cruise ship, the Chipmunks and Chipettes accidentally go overboard and end up marooned in a tropical paradise. They soon discover their new turf is not as deserted as it seems. The characters are voiced by Jason Lee as Dave, Justin Long as Alvin, Matthew Gray Gubler as Simon, Jesse McCartney as Theodore, Amy Poehler as Eleanor, Anna Faris as Jeanette and Christina Applegate as Brittany. (Rated G, 1H 27M)

YOUNG ADULT Jan 25 at 8:00pm/ Jan 27 at 2:30pm — Mavis Gary, a writer of teen literature, returns to her small hometown to relive her glory days and attempt to reclaim her happily married high school sweetheart. When returning home proves more difficult than she thought, Mavis forms an unusual bond with a former classmate who hasn't quite gotten over high school either. (Rated R, 1H 34M)

THE ADVENTURES OF TIN TIN Jan 28 & 29 at 12:00pm — Steven Spielberg directs this animated action adventure. Tin Tin and Captain Haddock set off on a treasure hunt for a sunken ship commanded by Haddock's ancestor. But someone else is in search of the same ship. Jamie Bell voices TinTin, Daniel Craig is Ivanovich Sakharine/Red Rackham, and Andy Serkis is Captain Haddock/Sir Francis Haddock. This film has been voted best animated film, and the 3D is spectacular in true Steven Spielberg style. (Rated PG, 1H 47M)
